Re: PowerAngle rackets



I am happy to inform you that the stringing system of the PowerAngle tennis racket does conform to the rules of tennis. The ITF previously ruled on this issue with respect to rule 4a of the Rules of Tennis:

"The hitting surface of the racket shall be flat and consist of a pattern of crossed strings connected to a frame and alternately interlaced or bonded where they cross"

This rule is interpreted to mean that the strings must continue in a straight line after they intersect. Thus, the PowerAngle racket is consistent with this interpretation, and may be used in any match played according to the Rules of Tennis.
